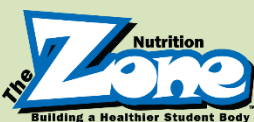

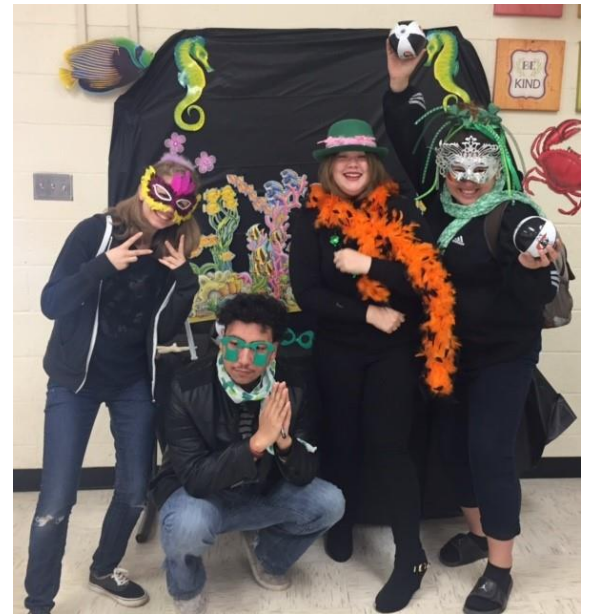
SECONDARY
