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Dear Patty:

Q: When is open enrollment?

- A: Open Enrollment begins October 1st through October 31st. Changes become effective January 1, 2017.
- Q: If I am not making any plan changes, will my elections roll over in the new plan year?
- A: No. All employees must enroll in benefits using Munis Employee Self Service.
- **Q:** Are there any changes to the medical plans offered?
- A: No, the District will continue to offer the BlueCare HMO Basic, BlueCare HMO Premium and BlueOptions PPO Standard Plans. The BlueCare HMO Basic plan continues to be employee board paid.
- **Q:** Are there any changes to the Prescription Plans?
- A: Yes. Prime Therapeutics will be the New Pharmacy Benefit Manager (PBM) effective January 1, 2017.
- **Q:** Who is Prime Therapeutics?
- A: Prime Therapeutics is Florida Blue's Pharmacy Benefit Manager. Florida Blue is one of the 14 Blue Cross Blue Shield Plans that collectively own Prime.

Q: Will we be receiving new ID cards?

A: Yes. All members enrolled will be issued a new ID card. The ID card is the same for Medical and Pharmacy services.

Q: Is the copay structure changing?

A: No, the copay structure will remain the same for 2017.

Q: Can I continue to use the same pharmacy to fill my prescriptions?

A: Yes, as long as the pharmacy is participating then you can continue to fill your prescriptions there. All you need to do is provide your new member ID card. A majority of the major chains such as Walgreens, CVS and Wal-Mart are in the network.

Q: Is there a new Prescription Mail Order company?

A: Yes, Prime Therapeutics' mail order company is PrimeMail.

These medications must be ordered from our participating specialty pharmacies, CareMark Specialty Pharmacy or Prime Specialty Pharmacy.
