MY ROADMAP TO COLLEGE WHAT SHOULD I BE DOING?

High School

College

FIRST SEMESTER (NOW – DEC)

- Start/complete applications, adhering to priority deadlines
- Retake SAT and/or ACT
- Apply for financial aid and scholarships
- Keep your grades up!

SECOND SEMESTER (JAN – JUNE)

- Continue community service and other non-classroom activities
- Compare financial aid award letters
- Make final decision by May 1st
- Graduate and enjoy the next chapter

Colleges use SAT scores for admissions and merit-based scholarships

Why take the test?

Colleges use ACT scores for admissions and merit-based scholarships

Reading (65 min)
Writing & Language (35 min)
Math (25 min. w/o calculator; 55 min. w/ calculator)
Essay (Optional) (50 min)

Test Structure

English (45 min)
Math (60 min)
Reading (35 min)
Science Reasoning (35 min)
Essay (optional) (40 min)

3 hours w/o essay
3 hours, 50 minutes w/ essay

Length

2 hours, 55 minutes w/o essay
3 hours, 40 minutes w/ essay

5 reading passages

4 reading passages

None

Science

1 science section testing your critical thinking skills, NOT your specific science knowledge

Arithmetic
Algebra I and II
Geometry, Trigonometry, and Data Analysis

Math

Some math questions DO NOT allow you to use a calculator

Calculator?

You CAN use a calculator on all math questions

Optional. The essay will test your comprehension of a source text.

Essays

Optional. The essay will test how well you evaluate and analyze complex issues.

Scale of 400 – 1600
(200-800 per area)

How it's Scored

Scored on a scale of 1-36
(each section averaged for an overall composite)

UNIVERSITY

- 12 public universities within the State University System
- Bachelor's degree, approximately 120 credits
- Competitive application process
- Priority deadlines; varied notification plan

STEPS TO APPLY: UNIVERSITY

1. Submit an application online and pay the application fee (or use a fee waiver if eligible)
2. Send your official test scores directly from ACT or SAT/CollegeBoard
3. Request that LOLHS send your official transcript to the university (or submit the SSAR, if required). Transcript request can be found on the LOLHS website banner.

All must be received by the college **BEFORE** their deadline date in order for your application to be considered.

COMMUNITY/STATE COLLEGE ASSOCIATE OF ARTS (A.A.)

- 28 state colleges
- 60 general education credits in Communications, Math, Science, Humanities, Social/Behavioral Sciences
- *NOT* career specific, generals only
- Designed to transfer to a university

Benefits

- Lower tuition cost
- Smaller class sizes
- Open admissions policy
- Credits will transfer to all state universities; Identified pathways
- Guaranteed admission to a university within the state of FL

APPLICATION PROCESS: COMMUNITY/STATE COLLEGE

1. Submit an application online and pay the application fee (or use a fee waiver if eligible)
2. Send your official test scores directly from ACT or SAT/CollegeBoard OR take PERT at the college to determine appropriate course placement for English & Math
3. Request that LOLHS send your official transcript to the college

Open Admissions!

Recommended time to apply is by March of the student's senior year.

Fall 2019 applications will open November 2018

FINANCIAL AID

“Financial Aid” is ALL funding to pay for college:

1. **Institutional Aid** – From the college
2. **Federal Aid** - FAFSA
3. **State Aid** – Office of Student Financial Assistance
4. **Private Scholarships** – Seek and find



INSTITUTIONAL AID

How do I get it?

1. Apply to the college early!
2. Have the best GPA and test scores as possible
3. Generally you're considered for merit-based scholarships at the time of application. No separate application required.

FEDERAL AID

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Opens October 1st for the 2019 school year
- Need-based grants, Student Loans, Work-Study program

STATE OF FLORIDA AID

Office of Student Financial Assistance – Florida Financial Aid Application

- Application Opens October 1st
- Many grants and scholarships ***including*** Bright Futures
- Scholarship \$ can only be used at FL post-secondary institutions

FL BRIGHT FUTURES

FLORIDA ACADEMIC SCHOLAR (FAS)

100% of tuition and fees (public institution)
\$300/semester stipend for expenses

Requirements:

3.5 weighted GPA (Core classes plus 2cr. WL)
29 ACT **or** 1290 SAT
100 hours of community service

FLORIDA MEDALLION SCHOLAR (FMS)

75% of tuition and fees (public institution)
\$300/semester stipend for expenses

Requirements:

3.0 weighted GPA (Core classes plus 2cr. WL)
26 ACT **or** 1170 SAT
75 hours of community service

Eligibility must be met by graduation!
