MUSICAL AGREEMENT AND PERMISSION FORM

We are pleased to announce the Kindergarten Musical Production! This year we will perform: *Bada Bing it's Spring*. We are very excited about presenting this show with our talented primary students! The show is scheduled for a performance on **Wednesday, April 22nd, 2026**, in the Longleaf cafeteria.

We are thrilled that you have shown interest in being a part of this year's musical. In order to continue producing the high-quality productions that Longleaf Elementary has established, it is necessary that you adhere to the following rules and expectations. Please read this information carefully. Students and parents/guardians both need to sign the agreement page. If you are planning to audition, you must return the signed paper to Ms. Rodriguez by Friday, January 16th, 2026, or bring it to your audition date.

Auditions will be held as follows:

THE AUDITION PROCESS

All Auditions will occur in the week of January 12th- 16th during music class. For those absent from their music time, please email Ms. Rodriguez.

All students that wish to audition must turn in their musical audition packet by and no later than Friday, January 16th to Ms. Rodriguez, or bring it to your audition date (be sure to look at your child's enrichment schedule to confirm day and time). All interested students must audition!

- Each student will have an individual audition, meaning they will perform the script reading (monologue) and sing the audition song by themselves. The song does not have to be memorized. A copy of the monologue will be given to students. It is HIGHLY encouraged that the monologue is memorized so students can act more confidently.
- There is NO SMALL PART in this show. An ensemble member is JUST AS IMPORTANT as lead/supporting characters. If you accept a part in the ensemble, you will be a vital part in making this show a success!

MUSICAL RULES, REGULATIONS, AND EXPECTATIONS

- Students MUST attend all rehearsals for which they are scheduled! If the student has 3 unexcused absences, they will not be permitted to be in the show. Students can miss a rehearsal if it is excused by a parent/guardian due to illness or an emergency only. Excused absences can be made for medical appointments, pre-show planned appointments, or other events. MUSICAL RULES, REGULATIONS, AND EXPECTATIONS

- Students MUST attend all rehearsals for which they are scheduled! **If the student has 3 unexcused absences, they will not be permitted to be in the show.** Although content will be practice in class, songs and lines should also be practiced at home for at least 10 minutes a day to ensure actors are confident and comfortable!

Rehearsals will begin on **Friday March 6th, 2026**. Drop off will occur in the **bus loop** and will begin at 8:25 AM until 8:35 AM. Anyone who arrives after 8:35 will have to enter through the front office. Students can miss a rehearsal if it is excused by a parent/guardian due to illness or an emergency only. Excused absences can be made for medical appointments, pre-show planned appointments, or other events. Character break-down

Children: These characters are curious and eager to know when Spring is going to appear. These actors should be good at showing emotions such as sadness, disgust, scared, and anxious.

Narrators: These actors help move our story along and should be acting with an inquisitive, excited, and confident tone. These actors should be very prepared to know their lines.

Flowers: Rosie, Posey, Daisy, Iris, Poppy, Lily, Petunia, Tulip, Peony, Inpatients, Bluebell, Crocus, and Morning Glory are the silly flowers we are waiting for to bloom. Each flower has their own unique personality brought out through the physicality, costume, and tone of their dialogue. These actors should feel comfortable be their unique self and bring their personality to the stage.

Dandelions: These weeds are sick and tired of the treatment they've been given. These actors should feel comfortable displaying feelings of sadness, despair, Pride,

Dandelion Queen/King: This Character has a big job delivering a long monologue about the mystery of Spring's delayed appearance. This actor should be confident, and sound regal while delivering their lines.

Birds: This joyous bird helps us celebrate Springs arrival. These actors should be comfortable showing excitement through their dialogue.
